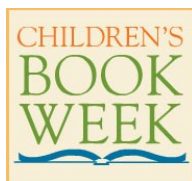
April 25th @ 6:30 pm Book Club — The Prayer Box by Lisa Wingate

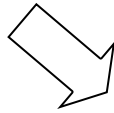


April 30th — Start of Children's Book Week (the library is signed up to participate in this national event) Let's kickoff the week with lots of fun!!!

They're free for you to borrow, so help yourselves.

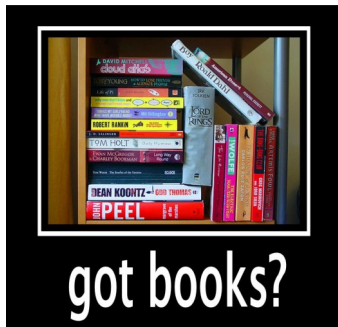
Come and meet your heroes, old and new,
