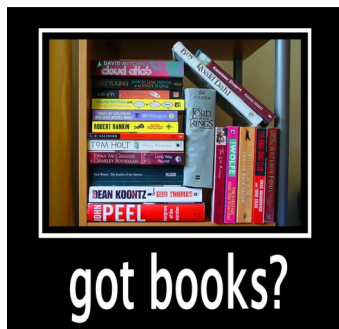
From the granddaughter of the Library Assistant — ***Good Dog Paw*** by Chinlun Lee (she loves books about animals and learning to count
